



## **Preschool**

In Waitaki there are kindergartens, playcentres, early learning centres and home-based care. All centres must meet NZ government standards to operate, however they vary in the type of education they provide, the ages they cater for, the type of building they operate from, and the fees they charge.

Kindergartens are the government run early education provider.

Playcentres have more parent involvement and opportunities for parents to become educators if they wish to complete the training courses.

The early learning centres generally have longer hours which may suit working people better.

Home based care is at a person's home in a family environment with limited ratios of children to carers.

Ultimately you need to choose the best setting for your child and the best way to make a choice is to go and visit with your child.

# **Primary**

In NZ it is compulsory to attend school from the age of six, however nearly all children start at age five.

There are five town based primary schools. Fenwick, Te Pakihi o Maru, Pembroke, St Josephs and Weston. Some of these schools have enrolment zones so it is recommended that you choose the closest primary school to your home.

Oamaru Intermediate is the only school in North Otago which soley caters for years seven and eight students. It is zoned.

There are many rural schools. Ardgowan, Duntroon, Five Forks, Hampden, Kakanui, Maheno, Omarama, Palmerston, Papakaio, Totara and Waitaki Valley.

## Secondary

Waitaki Girls' High School and Waitaki Boys' High School are single sex schools, while St Kevin's College and East Otago High School (Palmerston) are coeducational schools.
